#### **NLTG Traineeships in the Workplace**

Traineeships are designed for motivated young people aged between 16-18\*, who are qualified below level 3 and who want to gain valuable work experience. The NLTG Traineeship programme provides a work experience opportunity with a local company, supporting learners gain the skills and experience needed to progress to an Apprenticeship. Alongside a high quality work placement, NLTG will support the development of the vital work preparation skills looked for by employers, including: communication, team working, confidence, maths and English. Learners will also receive: an allowance; any required Personal Protective Equipment (PPE); support in enhancing their CV, writing strong job applications and developing their interview skills. A Traineeship can last between 6 weeks and 24 weeks.

#### **NLTG Study Programme**

NLTG's Study Programme offers two exciting, full-time, pre-Apprenticeship programmes to 16-18\* year olds. The programmes are delivered by our expert team from our state of the art centres in Accrington, Oldham and Bury. - maths and English qualifications (if learners don't already have GCSE grades A\*-C or 4-9).

- a full time programme which means parents/ guardians will be entitled to child benefits.
