Commentary: Larches Attainment 8 figures only include approved qualifications in order that they can be compared to other schools. Even so they are higher than local, regional and national figures for alternative providers. A lot of our students take alternative qualifications that do not form part of the government's Progress 8 figure. If our non-approved qualifications were included these figures would be even higher

- The % of students entered for GCSE maths and English continues to be double the national average for PRU's, although is lower than last year due to less students being entered for English Language
- Almost 100% of students who attended achieved a pass in at least one qualification with the exception of one student
- We have significantly increased the number of students gaining 5+ GCSE's at grade 4+ (20%)
- This is reflected in a significant increase in our Attainment 8 figure
- This is due to increases in the number of students gaining a grade 4+ in Maths, English language and Science and a broadening of the number of option subjects
